Last hours to complete CPSA Survey re Freedom of expression and CPSA's role

In her <u>November 14 President's Letter</u> AMA President, Dr. Shelley Duggan, wrote about government's survey regarding "legislative changes to safeguard freedom of expression for regulated professionals." Although the AMA has not received a reply from government, the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Alberta is conducting a survey that provides an opportunity for you to express your opinion about freedom of expression as a physician and a self-regulated professional.

The survey **closes TODAY at noon (Friday, November 29)** and is seeking your opinion as to whether the current guidance of CPSA aligns with the perspectives of regulated members and what the role of the regulator should be in this space. Responses will be kept confidential and aggregate, anonymized responses will help to guide policy and inform applicable <u>Standards of Practice</u> at CPSA.

President's tour postponed

Due to scheduling conflicts related to advocacy and discussions with government, the last three stops on the AMA President's *Local Doctors, Local Issues* tour will be postponed until the new year. AMA President, Dr. Shelley Duggan and AMA Executive Director, Karina Guy will visit Fort McMurray, Grande Prairie and Red Deer in the new year to host town hall meetings and hear directly from members about their local issues, concerns and ideas.

Physician Recruitment and Retention Support Program (PRRSP) launched this week

The PRRSP is a temporary program, funded by Alberta Health, which provides eligible physicians with financial support to continue practicing in underserved rural communities in Alberta. This program

provides \$15M per year, for two years to eligible physicians. That works out to two payments of roughly \$4,500 per eligible year for every eligible physician – plus a top-up at the conclusion of the program. To qualify for payment through this program, you must have provided insured medical services in an eligible rural community in Alberta for at least 100 days during one or both of the 2022/2023 or 2023/2024 fiscal years. Note that if you declare that you are eligible, please allow two to three weeks for your eligibility to be reviewed and payment to be processed.

Don't forget! Claim your 2024/2025 CME benefit

The Continuing Medical Education benefit program supports physician learning and quality improvement and improves patient outcomes by funding continuous professional development and physician practice improvement activities. The 2024/2025 CME benefit program is provided through an agreement between the AMA and Alberta Health and is administered by the AMA. It provides a benefit of \$2,200 per physician for CME expenses incurred between April 1, 2024, and March 31, 2025. The deadline to submit 2024/2025 CME claims is March 31, 2025.

Referral information available online for patients through My Personal Records

As of October 31, Albertans will be able to view referral information for urology consults entered in the Netcare eReferral system dated October 31, 2024, and later. Referral information will be viewable through the My Personal Records (MPR) application and will include referral date, referring provider, reason for referral, referral statuses and referral status reason.

The first release of referral information in MPR will be for urology consults only. Referrals sent to other specialties will be released at a later date.
