Emergency Medicine

Updates

Good Faith Billings - The government is close to finalizing their submission to us and we will hopefully receive it in the next two to three weeks. We will then review the submission and determine if it is acceptable. The last submission had too many exclusions and would have been too hard to implement. Once we have received it, we will update section members.

ANDI - We anticipate we will be in the middle section for adjusted net daily income based on hours worked. We would not be adversely affected; however, we will also not receive a larger allocation either. We are pushing for an increase in after-hours modifiers as less and less specialties want to perform after-hours work in the hospitals.

ED Flow - We have pushed the government on improving our flow of patients to the wards and requested metrics be posted on time to consult to admission and average percentage of EIP's in the departments. EIP's peaked at 40% last fall and are currently sitting at 30%. Staffing challenges remain with respect to nursing and ancillary staff.
