Let's Talk Cholesterol – A new online clinical decision support for patients in Alberta

We're excited to share 'Let's Talk Cholesterol' – a new resource developed by patient partners and family physicians.

Dyslipidemia affects 1 in 3 Canadians, but from our focus groups, patients don't always understand dyslipidemia or how to choose the best treatment option for them. 'Let's Talk Cholesterol' is a comprehensive decision support tool, co-created with input from patient partners, family physicians, and specialists. It features patient-centred resources and a physician guide, written by family physicians, to facilitate evidence-based cholesterol management.

Starting in November 2023, a link to the 'Let's Talk Cholesterol' website is included on lipid lab results in Alberta. By visiting the site and reading through the material, patients can learn about dyslipidemia, statin indicated conditions, and treatment options.

Help Alberta get immunized – Alberta's fall vaccine program has launched

Alberta's immunization program began Monday, October 16, offering influenza and COVID-19 vaccines, free of charge, to all Albertans six months of age and older. The vaccine is available through public health clinics, local pharmacies and doctors' offices.

Vaccines are our best line of defense against infectious diseases, and physicians and health care teams are in the ideal position to educate patients about the importance of getting vaccinated. You can address fear and trepidation around vaccine hesitancy, identify patients at risk of serious outcomes with influenza and/or COVID-19 infection, and reach out to patients when they are eligible to receive a vaccine.

Section update

We continue to face high volumes and we are challenged with both physician and nursing staffing issues especially at our rural sites. EIP's are climbing with the combination of ILI and covid patients. We are advocating for increased inpatient capacity as AHS has only added about 150 acute care beds since 2016.

We are challenged with after-hours coverage and have pushed this issue with the AMA. Most specialists are tired due to their own work demands and after-hours coverage adds another layer to their day. We are advocating for increase remuneration for after-hours work to help improve coverage at these times.

Good faith finally seems to be happening. It will be automated so as to be easier to use and reduce the likelihood of rejections. It will be retroactive to April 2022. Go live date is February 6, 2024.

Choosing Wisely has just recently released a new Bronchiolitis Toolkit for care of the pediatric patient with bronchiolitis.

Bronchiolitis is a viral infection that mostly affects infants and children under the age of two. In most cases, children will get better without the need for additional tests or treatments. Despite this, more than half of children with bronchiolitis receive unnecessary tests and treatments, like antibiotics or chest X-rays. When it comes to bronchiolitis, less is best.

Section of Rural Medicine

RESIDE update

RhPAP's Rural Education Supplement and Integrated Doctor Experience (RESIDE) program supports new-in-practice, Canadian-trained family physicians with a financial benefit of up to \$120,000 to practice in an [eligible rural Alberta community](#) for a term of two or three years. Residents in their final year (R2 or R3) of a Canadian family medicine residency program and physicians who graduated from a Canadian family medicine residency program in the last five years are eligible to apply.

The pilot phase of the RESIDE program will end on March 31, 2024. R2/R3 residents and new-in-practice family physicians who are interested in RESIDE must submit a [RESIDE application](#).
