Dear Members,

On December 19, 2024, when the government announced that the PCCM would be implemented, I told you that the AMA and ACTT would provide resources and change management supports, including information sessions, that would help you decide if the PCCM is the right fit for you and your practice. The first information session was held this past Wednesday, January 8, and more than 1,200 people attended. During the session, I walked attendees through some of the details, and with the help of Dr. Trevor Day, member of the SFM Executive, we offered a real-time demonstration of the [web-based calculator tool](#) to show how the PCCM would impact a real physician practice. I want to extend my deepest thanks to Dr. Shelley Duggan for starting us off, Dr. Day for sharing his data, our moderator, Dr. Gerry Prince, and the entire AMA/ACTT team, who moved so quickly after the announcement to put the information session together. I know there is a lot of information to process and that there are still a few things that are being worked on in advance of the April 1, 2025, PCCM implementation. As I explained during the January 8 information session, the RRNP and how it fits under the PCCM is under review and we are still discussing what will happen with locum physicians. Those who attended came with lots of questions, and we answered what we could that night. We are in the process of updating the [PCCM FAQ document](#) to address questions we couldn't get to during the session.

If you have specific questions about the PCCM, I encourage you to use the [inquiry and feedback form](#), as all questions are being tracked and themed, so they can help shape available resources and future information sessions. [The next PCCM session is planned for Wednesday, January 29, 2025](#), and will focus on PCCM eligibility and enrolment.

You'll be hearing from me – frequently – over the next few weeks as we help members understand if the PCCM will work for them and get ready for implementation.
