Two Grants Available

1. Rural Team Recruitment Grant Program

Purpose:

Cost-share support for additional non-physician/NP team members in rural clinics

What you receive:

Max \$72,500/role/year for 2 years

What you provide:

- Max \$72,500/role/year for 2 years
- Quarterly timesheets
- Collaboration on program evaluation
- Commitment to sustaining additional role post-grant

2. Municipality Supported Clinics Grant

Purpose:

 Cost-share support for rural municipalities with existing infrastructure to implement team-based models of care by taking over ownership of/operate clinics or supporting operation of clinics

What you receive:

Max \$200,000/year matched for 2 years

What you provide:

- ≥ 50% total funding costs
- Collaboration on program evaluation
- Commitment to sustaining post-grant

Application Process Overview

Before applying, ensure:

- Rural Team: Clinic can cover 50% of total funding costs/role
- Municipality: Municipality can cover ≥50% of total funding costs
- Community is on <u>RRNP Community Rate Table</u>

Timeline:

- EOI due Nov 30th at 4pm
 - Email to <u>PrimaryHealthCareGrant@gov.ab.ca</u> with subject line "Rural Team Recruitment Grant Program" or "Municipality Supported Clinics Grant Program"
- Grant funding starts early 2025

Importance of Submitting EOIs

High volume of EOIs shows:

- Demand and Unmet Need
- Potential Impact of Funding
- Need for Future Funding
- Need for Long-Term Solutions


