## General news

### **Vaccine distribution to community medical clinics will pause on May 20, 2024 – Order today!**

Due to contract expiration in May 2024, Alberta Health will be pausing provincially funded vaccine distribution to medical clinics effective May 20, 2024. Remaining vaccine inventory can continue to be provided to patients until inventory is depleted or expired. Please continue to follow the AVI expectations and responsibilities when managing your remaining provincially funded vaccine inventory.

To meet vaccine demands in the next 2-3 months, medical clinics are encouraged to place final orders with Accuristix to top up their inventory of Tdap vaccine. Please note that all final orders from medical clinics must be submitted to Accuristix by end of day May 3, 2024. To ensure supply is available for all medical clinics, a maximum order limit of 100 doses will be placed on final orders. Final orders will be distributed to medical clinics between May 6-14.

Distribution of provincially funded vaccine to community medical clinics is anticipated to resume in the fall. In the meantime, Albertans are to be referred to their preferred pharmacy or Alberta Health Services Public Health centre for immunization service. ### **SOMB amendments are live – Effective April 1, 2024**

An [AHCIP Bulletin](#) was issued late last week to inform physicians about amendments to the Schedule of Medical Benefits (SOMB).

The AMA Agreement provided an overall 1% increase to the SOMB for the 2023-24 fiscal year, distributed to each AMA member section via macro allocation, as outlined in [Schedule 3](#) (page 30) of the Agreement. In accordance with these section increases; the AMA and its sections recommended a series of structural changes and individual adjustments to rates of benefits for insured services that are reflected in the new SOMB.

Please note that these changes are retroactive to April 1, 2024. Claims for services that have already been submitted and have had a rate adjustment will be reassessed and paid at the April 1, 2024 rate for dates of services April 1, 2024 onward.

Physicians do not need to resubmit their valid claims to receive the adjusted rates. Claims for services that are new additions (e.g., 18,29EA) or changes to existing fee codes (e.g., 03.03AO) may be submitted to AH for dates of April 1, 2024 and onward.

#### **Request for feedback**

It is not hard to find examples of the acute care crisis in the everyday work section members are doing. Currently the action-reaction dynamic within each hospital and the advocacy, strategy and collateral damages are very localized. Localized solutions are critical but collective advocacy can be very powerful. It would be very helpful to hear from an Internal Medicine section representative from each hospital across the province to help shape our strategic action plan. Some of the key issues are:

- Strategies to financially incentivize the MPR designation and workload.
- Levelling of daily care fees across specialties.
- Appropriate compensation for after hours and weekend work.
- Investment in physician enabling resources including non-physician care team members.
- Changes in the education and service landscape of residency programs.
- Appraisal of the metastatic growth of the administrative load.
- Explore sustainable and remunerated models for hospitals to have after hours physician support.
- Incentivize the care of patients with complex chronic disease across acute care and community care.
