
#### Interpretation

What are your primary concerns with respect to COVID-19? (Select all that apply) (N = 4,467)




### **Urgent Needs and Preparing for What Comes Next COVID-19**



**65% agree** they are confident that healthcare providers will be able to meet the needs of Albertans over the next few months. (N = 4,462)







**54% agree** everything possible is being done to support my safety when caring for patients during COVID-19. (N = 4,336)





<sup>\*</sup>The significance test simply compares the first filter with any other filter in the report. It looks at the difference between the means and percentage points and draws a conclusion as to whether or not the differences are significant or insignificant. If it sees a significant difference, the program places an asterisk (\*) next to the number in question. The significance is impacted by the number of individuals responding.



- They want the public to understand that care is being threatened and impacted



As a result of the Physician Funding Framework, which of the proposed items will have the most negative impact in your delivery of care. (Select all that apply) (N = 4,494)




# Urgent Needs and Preparing for What Comes Next Physician Funding Framework




