General news

Don't miss out – funding available from two programs

Approximately 5,000 members have not yet claimed their CME reimbursement for the 2023/24 program year. AMA members are entitled to a \$2,200 benefit for CME expenses incurred between April 1, 2023 and March 31, 2024.

Physicians have until March 31 to use their CME allotment and will have until April 30 to submit their claims to the AMA for reimbursement. Last year, we returned approximately \$3.8 million in unused allotments to government and we are on track to return even more if members don't take advantage of CME benefits.

The Panel Management Support Program (PMSP) is a temporary program, funded by Alberta Health, which provides eligible physicians financial support for costs related to panel management and practice improvement activities. This funding was announced in October 2023 when the [MAPS](#) final panel reports were released.

Participating in panel management and utilizing support staff in practice improvement activities will help physicians maximize their payments for the PMSP. Physicians that leverage [CII/CPAR](#) to manage their panels will be automatically eligible for [additional funding](#). Updates

We know there have been issues with the implementation of Good Faith claims. We have sent a letter and spoken directly to the Minister of Health about the difficulties in the implementation process and getting compensated. We are trying to remove the barriers to this process.

We know that lack of after-hours support in hospital is a huge issue and continue to work with the AMA and government to increase after-hours compensation to stabilize this process and increase supports for consultants to keep the inpatient process supported. We are also trying to get weekend evenings/nights and stat evening/nights compensated differently than other evenings/nights.

Volumes remain high due to population growth and lack of primary care. This will hopefully improve with primary care stabilization.

Laboratory Physician's Contracts - After a long negotiation and mediation process, the Laboratory Physicians finally signed their contracts with Alberta

Precision Laboratories (APL) in March 2024. The new contracts start from April 1, 2024, and will go until March 31, 2026.

The Joint Workload Advisory Committee (JWAC) - The JWAC that was negotiated during the mediation officially commenced with its first meeting in March 2024. The committee is co-chaired by Dr. Marcia Abbott (ASLP-Red Deer) and Dr. Michael Mengel (APL-Edmonton).
